KQO Fall Meeting, Colby KS September 25-27, 2026

It's time to register for the Fall gathering with all your quilt friends from across the state of Kansas. We are going to the Western part of the state to Colby, Kansas this September. If it seems like a long drive for you, there is a bus group you can join and leave the driving to someone else. Look for the details in this newsletter.

We will be meeting at the City Limits Convention Center which is attached to the Quality Inn and Suites that is located right off I-70. Quality Inn address: 2225 S. Range Ave, Colby KS, Phone: [785-785-6793](tel:785-785-6793). Be sure to mention that you are with Kansas Quilters Organization. Room options are: Standard (2 queen beds) - \$99.00, Single King - \$109.00, King Suite with pull out sofa - \$119.00, King Suite with 2 rooms - \$129.00

There is free WiFi, free breakfast, indoor pool, and fitness center. It has an onsite restaurant and bar and is connected to our meeting rooms. Recommend booking your rooms ASAP, especially if you have any special needs like bottom floor or handicap accessible. Confirm the cancellation policy just in case your plans change, but I believe it is 24 hours before check in. Good news is they are going to allow us to set up our machines and sew Thursday afternoon/evening after the 4 pm check in time.

KQO has great classes planned! You will have the choice of various workshops – full or half-day and always the UFO room. Look through this newsletter for details on all of the options.

We are planning the business meeting to take place during the lunches, which will be a bit longer, so we aren't rushed. 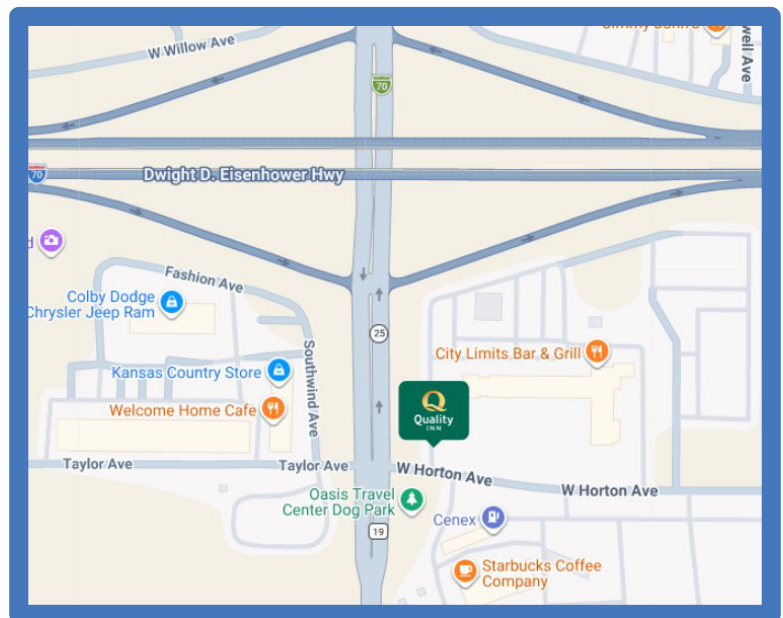

Fall 2026 National Speaker

Marci Baker - Bio

Recognized internationally for her expertise in quilting, Marci enjoys sharing ideas that simplify the process of quilting.

A native of Dallas, Texas, Marci has loved sewing for years, making her first quilt at age 9 and sewing her own clothes in high school and college. She began teaching quilting in 1989 for her local quilting guild and shops. Marci graduated with a bachelor's degree and master's degree in math. In 1993, she started Alicia's Attic with concepts that combine her love of math with her love of quilting. Quilting became a great way to share her knowledge with others.



As an admirer of traditional quilts, Marci was inspired to author books on Not Your Grandmother's™ Quilts. This series uses traditional patterns people associate with the grandmother and simplifies the technique. She has invented several tools to help make quilting easier for all. Her Know Before You Sew™ solution cards take common problems quilters encounter and provide easy-to-understand solutions.

Marci spends much of the year traveling and teaching classes for quilting guilds and trade shows. Some of Marci's travels include Canada, Brazil and most recently Dubai.

Enthusiasm and inspiration for quilting can be seen throughout her lectures, workshops, and books. She has been featured in Redbook, on Home and Garden TV's Simply Quilts, Quilters' News Network, NBC's The Jane Pauley Show, and has been published in American Quilter Magazine and Traditional Quiltworks.

In 2006, she expanded Alicia's Attic by purchasing Clearview Triangle from Sara Nephew. They continue to collaborate on new designs and techniques. Their latest three publications have received distinction with Living Now and Foreword publishing groups. These ideas and Marci's simplifying methods have come together as Quilting with Marci Baker, inspiring today's quilter.

Marci and her husband, Clint, currently live in Fort Collins, Colorado, where they enjoy the outdoors and the beauty of nature that is so abundant in Colorado. She travels frequently to upstate New York where her sons are attending college.

Peek-a-Boo, Classic, I-See-You

Supply List

Class Description: Wow! You can make this impressive 3-D optical illusion with simple value selections described below. Build the blocks using the strip-piecing method – so it's fast, too! In fact, it is easy enough for a confident beginner to do. Join our class and see how your blocks stack up!

Supplies

- Sewing machine with basic accessories
- Rotary cutter, ruler (at least 6x12), and mat
- 8" or 10" Clearview Triangle™ 60 degree ruler recommended available at class (12" and Super 60 will also work).
- "3-D Magic!" by Marci Baker and Sara Nephew available at class.
- Thread (medium gray or beige)
- Piece of flannel or batting to use as a design wall, optional



← Peek-a-Boo
← Classic
← I-See-You

Fabric Selection

To learn the technique in class you will need at least two color combinations with 1/4 yd each of light, medium, and dark of each color, so a total of six 1/4 yds. First, select the light (as light as possible), the dark (as dark as possible), and then find a medium that doesn't blend with the light or the dark.

Preparation Prior to Class: Instructions will be emailed prior to class.

A Little about Junelle Hills

Sewing has always been a part of my life! I made my first (of many!) garment in 1968, my first curtain in 1985, my first quilt in 1989 and the rest is history.

Hello, my name is Junelle Hills. I was born and raised in Northwest Kansas, and I am still here! I have been sewing since the third grade. Sewing most of my clothing gave me many hours of machine time. After graduating high school in Oakley, I moved to Colby, working for Kansas State University eight years. After figuring out my body was not built to throw bales and 60# feed sacks any more I started my own custom tailoring business. It was a rewarding, but challenging experience. Later I went to work at the local fabric store (Joyce's Fabrics). It was a most rewarding experience and lead to other opportunities.



In 1988 I opened *The Interior Connection*, a custom window treatment store. The fabric store (Joyce's Fabrics) sold draperies at the time, but they were eager to relinquish that part of the business, offering many of their supplies and resources to me. In 1989 I took my first quilt class, making a Trip Around the World Quilt. In 1990 I opened a second store 60 miles away. That about did me in....so I closed the second store and happily operated out of a small space on the west edge of town for 14 years. In January 2002, the fabric store owner asked me if I'd like to purchase the business. In February the deal was signed and the *Interior Connection and Quilt Cabin* venture was underway! We moved both business under one roof and had the cutest little curtain and quilt store. We outgrew the new space and moved again in 6 months to our current location, right north of I-70. It was a new set of responsibilities, more staff, retail, sewing machine sales, teaching classes, giving presentations and taking classes.

In my free time, I love to sew, travel, fish, hunt and golf.

Junelle Hills "Spin Class"-*Friday Full Day Workshop*

Have you ever wanted to take a SPIN CLASS and NOT have to ride a bike?? Well, this is your class. Come along and SPIN some creative designs with us!

Pattern provided in the class. By making ONE block style, you can have fun rotating the blocks in different directions to create optional layouts.

Class prep: Have 10" squares cut. Have 5" squares cut and a diagonal line drawn on back.

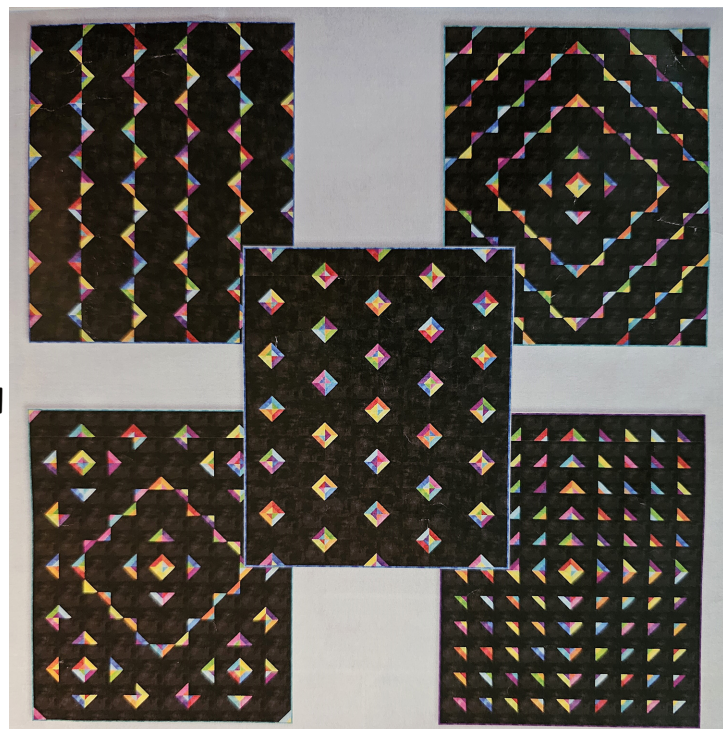
Quilt Size...95" x 114" 10 x 12 blocks
120...10" squares or 8 $\frac{2}{3}$ yds cut into 10" squares, 3 layer cakes
120...5" squares of a huge variety of fabrics, 3 charm packs
Binding ...1 yard
Backing...44/45...4 $\frac{2}{3}$ yds
108.....3 $\frac{1}{2}$ yds

Quilt Size...57" x 66 $\frac{1}{2}$ " 6 x 7 Blocks
42...10" squares or 3 $\frac{1}{8}$ yds cut into 10" squares, 1 or 2 layer cakes
42...5" squares of a huge variety of fabrics, 1 or 2 charm packs
Binding ... $\frac{5}{8}$ yard
Backing...44/45...3 $\frac{1}{2}$ yds
108.....1 $\frac{3}{4}$ yds

I have BLACK LAYER CAKES (\$40, WHILE SUPPLY LASTS) AND BRIGHT CHARM PACKS (\$14, WHILE SUPPLY LASTS). 785-462-3375 Quilt Cabin, Colby, KS.

In class, we'll make a number of blocks, put them on the design wall and watch different layouts come to life. The key to this project is to figure out how big you want your quilt and make the right number of blocks accordingly. Your blocks will finish 9 $\frac{1}{2}$ ".

The pictures give you a good idea of how your quilt will look with 120 blocks. Use it as a guide to downsize if you choose. Your design DOES NOT have to be symmetrical. It can be offset if you choose.



Quilt Size...76" x 76" 8 x 8 blocks
64...10" squares or 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ yds cut into 10" squares, 2 layer cakes
64...5" squares of a huge variety of fabrics, 2 charm packs
Binding ... $\frac{5}{8}$ yard
Backing...44/45...8 $\frac{3}{4}$ yds
108.....2 $\frac{1}{3}$ yds

Things to bring:
Machine in good working order
Thread, ripper, small mat to trim, rotary cutter
Light if you feel you need it
Small ruler (6 $\frac{1}{2}$ x 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ or 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ " square)
Machine foot pedal and power cord

Now she puts those skills to practice in her own community and corner of the state through the creative community of the quilt shop. LA Quilt Co is a gathering place for quilters, crafters and sewers of all levels of experiences and ages to create and dream.

Join this workshop to create a medium Project Bag that is cute and super functional for your sewing room or on the go projects. You will have two options to sign up for the class. Both come with everything you need to make a medium size Project Bag. Option 1 includes the fabric. Choose from a wide variety of precut Ruby Star Fabric. (it's like a mini quilt shop full of ruby star fabric right at your fingertips) or Option 2 you bring your own fabric. There will be additional supplies available to purchase if you would like to make the other size Project Bags.

- Handbag Zipper, 14 ½"

Veterans Block

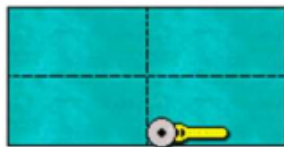

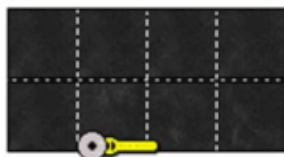
This makes a 12" block!



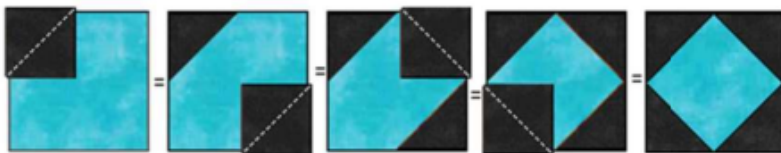
** Preparing the Pieces and Sewing the Block **



First cut the Color 2 7" x 13" rectangle into four 3-1/2" x 6-1/2" rectangles...

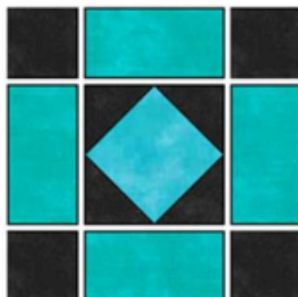


Then cut the Color 3 7" x 14" strip into eight 3-1/2" squares...



Place a Color 3 3-1/2" square right sides together, lined up with the upper left corner of the Color 1 6-1/2" square...

Mark the diagonal in the direction shown above, and sew ON the diagonal line. Trim off excess seam allowance and press the remainder towards the center square. Now sew another Color 3 3-1/2" square to the opposing corner in the same manner, and then to the two adjacent corners. Square this back to 6-1/2" if needed...



Now you are ready to piece the block! Refer to the diagram at left for placement. Make rows first, and then join rows to make the block. Be sure to alternate pressing directions, to avoid those bulky seams!

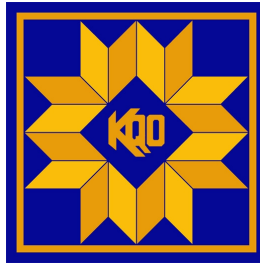
